
Feature Artist: Amadea Zuri Setian

This teacher was so excited from her discovery, she wanted to make sure our family paid close attention to my art skills. My dad drove straight to a frame shop, framed my first artwork, and happily shared with our family what took place.

Some years later, my mom published her book "Does God Have a Bicycle?" (currently available on amazon) using my paintings as illustrations for it. And the journey continued...

What art trends inspire your current artwork?

I get my inspirations from nature. Nature is my source of colors, shapes, and designs. Nature is so perfect, offering infinite options, I love learning from it.

How has your style changed over time?

My passion to express vividness of colors, and the harmony of their flow has not changed.

What has changed is my mind, since it is maturing over time. I perceive things differently, and the expression of my art reflects what I see.

Describe the best piece of art you've created?



When I was 9 years old, the owner of the "Gallery Amsterdam" in Carmel by the Sea Tony Vanderploeg discovered my art through my dad and began representing and selling my work until his very recent passing. Tony became like a family member; he was supportive, gentle, and kind.
